

The following is a copy of a letter received from Mr. E. W. Lamb, of Darling Point, dated April 27th.

Gentlemen,

Allow me to draw your attention to a "Perth W.A." newspaper at the School of Arts of April 11th., giving all account of an expedition of 26 men opening up a stock route from "Wiluna" to "Kimberley" in which the writer states, across desert country he found a splendid lot of natives, physically equal to any white-man of Australia: but what I specially wish to draw your attention to is, that they wore sandals made from the fibre of the mulga or some other plant.

I would suggest that you write to the Trustees of the W.A. Museum to send you a pair or two to be added to your collection. As stock will be travelling this route for the Perth market, I should think the Trustees might with a little inconvenience to themselves, accommodate you.
