Dear Mr. Glazert.

Since writing last note... I should like to add that in becoming the fibre the women roll it on the leg as well as in the hand. I did & mention to you about our unearthing a sort of token among our people here. — a package in a tree. It consisted of two colored cockatoo feathers & some native paint rolled in paper bark in layers until it covered considerable dimensions. It appears that this charm or others similar is in charge of theitch doctor of any bunch if natives we are knows the contents of this blem but himself. — This was opened in our case & everybody feel saying that we should all die as we had libberated some spirit — we opened the package in opposition to many protests. — Mr. Gribble here is head of the station and during a conversation tonight he was very emphatic that no information should be given for any specific purpose. He made some strange charges against that faculty in their attitude towards missions which I think personally are not true. I feel on the matter as I keenly interested in the subject myself. I believe that the best prospect for the work of any mission is to know as much about the nation as one possibly can, and you can understand the difficulties presented when the head of a station often obstructs at every point. It seems more unfortunate on account of the number of.
