I should be much obliged if you would kindly obtain the ~~detail~~ information that I will formulate below, regarding any specimens that you may have of the Aboriginal missile known very generally as the "Kangaroo hat", or Waggara in WA, all that would be needed is an ordinary pair of turners calipers, a wood rule, divided to $\frac{1}{8}$ of an inch and a letter weigher, spring balance would do, recording to half of, quarter ounces can be estimated,

Should the bulb be of obtuse sectional form, please give the extreme diameters, the shank can be taken to taper from the neck to the thin part or point where it is held when projected.
