(1.) No leave on account of illness shall be granted with pay if the sickness or illness has been caused by the misconduct of the officer to which himself or which point the Chief Librarian or the Director may send any registered medical practitioner to attend on and examine such officer at his residence. A fee of £1.00 shall be paid to the practitioner for his attendance and report, and if such report is in the opinion of the Chief Librarian

(2.) If any officer is absent from duty on account of illness or a contagious or infectious character he shall not return to duty without a written medical certificate by a registered medical practitioner stating that he may return without danger to others.

(3.) If any officer is absent from duty on account of illness and such absence has extended beyond three months he shall not be permitted to return to duty until a registered medical practitioner approved by the Commission has certified that he is fit to resume work.

(4.) If any officer is absent from duty on account of illness or a contagious or infectious character he shall not return to duty until a registered medical certificate by a registered medical practitioner stating that he may return without danger to others.

(5.) A triennial period to be the three years preceding the date of the application under consideration.

(6.) The amount of leave on pay provided for in the schedule must not be exceeded in any one triennial period.

(7.) Leave may be granted in one or more periods.
