I asked the manager of the  
Bon Marche to send you some specimens  
of good fitted Bonel Caps which I brought  
from Doué Island. They are not really  
good specimens. As I find that there  
are amongst the West Australian Blacks  
"Types". Just as there are Mutton heads  
amongst white folk. Which I found to  
my cost when I was teaching. So there  
are highly intelligent men and girls  
amongst the Blacks with whom I have  
been in constant touch since the year  
1908. Types also of character. The very  
gentle nervous shy refined Blacks and  
the coarse, repellent type which one  
meets constantly <sup>amongst white folk</sup> I hope you will

think the wood worthy of a corner in  
the Museum; They all spin, some  
most beautifully, but these specimens  
were done by quilts from the extreme  
west. Hall's Creek - Dinawica and  
Gillgarnia. Whom I landed at their beloved  
Musk homes last June.
