The University of Liverpool began its career as a University College in 1881, in 1884 it became part of the Victoria University at Manchester and in 1904 Liverpool College was separated from Owens College Manchester and became the University of Liverpool. The College began its work in January 1881 with seven endowed professorships and three lectureships, chiefly the gifts of prominent citizens.
