Some time ago a large number of native weapons were handed over by this Department to the Museum, and at the time it was understood that if any weapons were required by this Department at any time, such would be supplied.

Recently I asked the Keeper of Ethnology for a small collection to send to Victoria, and subsequently received a message that I was to communicate with you.
