Dear Sir:

I enclose two samples of work done by local natives, thinking some may be of value to you as specimens.

No. 1. is a cord made from human hair twisted by hand & is used as a sort of body belt. No. 2. is a cord for the same use & likewise made by hand from the fur of the full kangaroo the latter known locally as the "vigeda" (spelling phonetically).

There are still a number of old natives on this station & one is able to gather much of interest. I have a sort of old stone crusher, used I think for crushing seeds. None of the natives seem to recognise it. It is broken, but of value I think as a specimen. If you would like it I shall arrange to send it down, also I should be pleased to help you in any way that lies in my power.
